Safeguarding Newsletter

Dear Parents and Carers,

At Radlett Preparatory School, safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children is everyone's responsibility.

As such, we have created this termly newsletter to inform you of key safeguarding updates and helpful information around safeguarding issues.

What is Safeguarding?

Keeping Children Safe in Education 2022 defines safeguarding as:

- * protecting children from maltreatment
- preventing the impairment of children's mental and physical health or development
- * ensuring that children grow up in circumstances consistent with the provision of safe and effective care, and
- * taking action to enable all children to have the best outcomes.

What is a Designated Safeguarding Lead (DSL)?

Keeping Children Safe in Education 2022 explains that 'The designated safeguarding lead should take lead responsibility for safeguarding and child protection (including online safety).'

The role includes, but is not limited to:

- ensuring that all staff receive appropriate up-to-date training, including how to raise safeguarding concerns
- ensuring all staff understand the types of abuse and possible signs to be aware of
- communicating with parents/carers, the local authority and social workers
- maintaining accurate and secure records
- regularly reviewing schools safeguarding policies and procedures.
