## CURRICULUM POLICY

#### **Statutory Guidance**

This statutory policy has been reviewed in accordance with the following ISSR guidance:

2.— (1) The standard in this paragraph is met if—

(a) the proprietor ensures that a written policy on the curriculum, supported by appropriate plans and schemes of work, which provides for the matters specified in sub-paragraph (2) is drawn up and implemented effectively; and

(b) the written policy, plans and schemes of work-

(i) take into account the ages, aptitudes and needs of all pupils, including those pupils with an EHC plan;

and (ii) do not undermine the fundamental British values of democracy, the rule of law, individual liberty, and mutual respect and tolerance of those with different faiths and beliefs.

(2) For the purposes of paragraph (2)(1)(a), the matters are —

(a) full-time supervised education for pupils of compulsory school age (construed in accordance with section 8 of the Education Act 1996), which gives pupils experience in linguistic, mathematical, scientific, technological, human and social, physical and aesthetic and creative education;

(b) that pupils acquire speaking, listening, literacy and numeracy skills;

(c) where the principal language of instruction is a language other than English, lessons in written and spoken English, except that this matter does not apply in respect of a school which provides education for pupils who are all temporarily resident in England and which follows the curriculum of another country;

(d) personal, social, health and economic education which-

(i) reflects the school's aim and ethos;

and (ii) encourages respect for other people, paying particular regard to the protected characteristics set out in the 2010 Act(a);

(g) where the school has pupils above compulsory school age, a programme of activities which is appropriate to their needs;

(h) that all pupils have the opportunity to learn and make progress;

and (i) effective preparation of pupils for the opportunities, responsibilities and experiences of life in British Society

## Introduction

The School follows its own wide-ranging academic curriculum tailored to the needs of its able Students. The School is not required to follow the National Curriculum, however the foundations of the school's curriculum are built on the National Curriculum 2014 to which we add our own "Radlett Related Expectations" for each year group. These expectations ensure pupils are working consistently above the standard of their peers nationally. As a result, pupils make greater progress than those with similar starting points nationwide. A balanced academic course of study is provided for all children, working to our own syllabuses in the foundation subjects. The School will take all reasonably practicable measures and make the necessary reasonable adjustments to fulfil the requirements of a Student's SEN statement, EHC or ELPP. The curriculum is broad and balanced, and promotes the spiritual, moral, cultural, mental and physical development of pupils. All pupils are expected to acquire skills in speaking and listening, literacy and numeracy skills.

The School provides fulltime supervised education for Students between the ages of 4 and 11. The School provides a broad education, which gives them experience in linguistic, mathematical, scientific, technological, human and social, physical and aesthetic and creative education, appropriate for their ages and aptitudes (including any Student with a statement, EHC or ELPP). At each level, it prepares them for the opportunities, responsibilities and experiences of the next stage of their education and their lives.

## Aims of the Curriculum

It is the School's aim to provide each student with the appropriate skills and knowledge to develop fully their academic potential as well as developing their personal and social values in preparation for the next stage in their education.

Our objectives are to provide a curriculum which:

- Provides academic stretch and challenge, allowing pupils discover their strengths and to foster a love of learning.
- Provides the opportunity for all pupils to make progress.
- Is broad and balanced and encourages the pursuit of a wide range of interests.
- Includes age appropriate personal, social, health and citizenship education (PSHCE).
- Provides opportunity for pupils to think critically, solve problems and engage actively in their learning so that are well prepared for the next stage of education.
- Prepares students with the skills, habits and characteristics to enable them to thrive in an ever-changing world.
- Expects high standards speaking and listening, literacy and numeracy.
- Is underpinned by fundamental British Values.
- Encourages respect for other people, paying particular regard to the protected characteristics set out in the 2010 Equalities Act.

## **Fundamental British Values**

Our curriculum supports the Fundamental British Values of the rule of law, individual liberty, democracy, and mutual respect for and tolerance of those with different faiths and none, and those with different beliefs in a variety of ways including, but not limited to:

- Pupils have the opportunity to have their voices heard through: school council meetings and pupil questionnaires.
- Election of House and Sports Captains and school councillors is based on pupil votes.
- Through the PSHCE curriculum, pupils are given opportunities to learn about: Rules, rights and responsibilities; Participating; Belonging to groups; Debating; Improving the class / school; The democratic process; Communicating opinions; Local, national and global issues; Values for life
- Radlett Prep Golden Rules
- Behaviour expectations: sharing; taking turn; cooperation etc;

- School assemblies exploring a range of themes getting children to appreciate what is right / wrong; fair / unfair and understanding the consequences of their behaviour and actions.
- Visitors from other professions e.g. PCO and fire brigade also help reinforce key messages.
- Interviewing candidates in staff recruitment making decisions based on their observations.
- Opportunities to be involved in fund raising.
- Anti-bullying workshops.
- Providing opportunities for children to work collaboratively with one another e.g. Talk partners; group work; peer assessment and feedback; whole school theme weeks; team games etc. involvement in School Sports Partnership competitions etc.
- The school choir regularly visits and performs in the community. This includes to residents at local elderly residential care homes and Sainsburys.
- Parents from different faiths are welcomed into the school to work with the children.

#### **Curriculum Years 1 to 6**

The key goal of the curriculum is focused on giving students the knowledge and skills that prepare them for the opportunities, responsibilities and experiences of life beyond Radlett Preparatory School.

#### **Curriculum EYFS / Reception**

The school is exempt from the learning and development requirements of the EYFS statutory framework.

The school ensures there is a balance of structured teacher led activities and child-initiated activities with opportunities for learning in the indoor and outdoor environment. The curriculum includes physical education, French, computing, drama and music taught by specialist subject teachers.

#### **Curriculum allocation**

Curriculum allocation is reviewed yearly in line with ongoing assessments and the School Development plan. The students benefit from subject specialist teaching in PE, music, drama, French and computing. PSHE is taught in class and reinforces the importance of an awareness and understanding of the fundamental British values of democracy, the rule of law, individual liberty and mutual respect and tolerance of those with different faiths and beliefs. The programme of study can be viewed in the PSHE policy available on the school's website.
